Durability and longevity. Designed with both beauty and function in mind, Chilewich woven floor mats retain their distinctive colors and rich textures over many years of use, indoors and outdoors.

A sleek, stay-put backing. Our floor mats are cushioned with a commercial-grade latex backing that prevents slipping and curling. At just 0.14 inch in thickness, our mats fit easily under most doors.

Easy maintenance. Clean-up is easy. Sweep or vacuum to remove loose dirt or wipe clean with soap, water, and a soft sponge or cloth. **Newly expanded size range.** Ideal for outdoor spaces, our recently introduced "Super" size mat is an expansive 8 feet by 10 feet.

American craftsmanship. Our woven floor mats are designed and manufactured in the United States.

- Protection against mold and mildew. Strengthened by Microban, our mats resist stain- and odor-causing microbial growth. This protection works continuously for the lifetime of the product.

A guide to using our woven floor mats outdoors.

Placement

- Best suited to dry surfaces.
- Made with advanced color technology to prevent fading, but, like all textiles, mat may fade when placed in direct sunlight for extended periods.
- When placed atop a rough surface, latex backing may become abraded. This will not affect woven face of mat or its performance. A rug pad may be used to prevent abrasion.

Care

- Air out backing occasionally by turning mat over.
- When saturated with water, mat will absorb water into backing. Moisture will evaporate with exposure to sunlight and will migrate to any porous surface on which mat sits. Excess water can be mopped up as necessary.
- When moving or storing, roll up mat with woven fabric side facing out and tie loosely.
- Avoid placing objects made of rubber (including rubber castors) on your mat, as discoloration may occur.

Cleaning

- In case of moss or mold (which may grow on dirt or debris that is on or below mat), clean with a bleach solution or a hydrogen peroxide solution and then wipe with cloth.
- To deep clean, hand wash mat with water and light detergent, allowing it to air dry completely before placing it back on the floor.
